

had some questions about whether or not this area could, indeed, come up with some funds on their own. Now what transpired over the weekend, the FEMA team on Friday and over the weekend, the FEMA team which is the federal arm that went out and investigated this, they developed over the weekend, this past weekend, some final numbers, and so when we met on Monday, we finally had some...I guess I would not say final numbers, I want to reiterate that, this type of damage is a moving guess. Unfortunately, usually, the figure usually tends to go up, but we still have some objective numbers from some people who deal in this area on a regular basis, that is their job, they came in and said the damage is roughly in the public areas about \$5 million, is what it amounted to. And there is certainly more damage over and above that. The committee recommendation that we are talking about, and you can see in our handout, for Game and Parks, it appropriates 374,000 in General Funds, which would help assist in repairing storm-damaged facilities, allows 30,000 of that to be used in currently appropriated state building funds left over from replacing the dam at Atkinson. You may remember that from Senator Dierks' district, they're not using all that money. And also, what may happen on the Game and Parks, if FEMA money does, indeed, come true, a good portion of that 374,000 may, indeed, at some point in time may be replenished. If that does happen, that would be nice and we hope that it would. As far as the fish hatchery, it allows Game Cash Funds currently appropriated for the construction of new reservoirs, current estimates place the damage at only half a million dollars. The reimbursement from FEMA at 35 percent will total \$450,000, and it appropriates \$100,000 in the Game Cash Fund for the replacement of tools, equipment, and other personal property. Once again, this is contingent upon some FEMA funds to fully replace that fish hatchery. One of those things in the contract, the feds, when the feds gave this to us, we thought maybe we could give them back, give this situation back to them, but the clause in the federal contract said that we had to give it back to them in the same form they gave it to us. And so we have to repair it before we give it back to them, so that was not an option. The Historical Society, there is a museum out there. It broke out 70 some windows; appropriate \$9,230 in General Funds to repair the windows primarily in that Historical Society Building out there. And, once again, we hope that the FEMA reimbursement, if it does, indeed, come, will be \$6,923. The biggest dollar item comes from the Governor's emergency fund. This committee recommendation now...last week was only about, closer to a million dollars, increased it by a good share
