

commission all institutionally funded student financial aid awarded by the institution the previous year. I see there is an amendment on the desk to have this, I assume, apply to public institutions, nonprofit foundations, which I have no objection to. If we're going to begin to move in this area, it seems to me that we need to look at the total scholarship programs, both public and private, proprietary, and the opportunity to do that with clear information seems to be a reasonable approach as we embark upon this new public policy and I would move adoption of the amendment and will indicate if there is an amendment offered, or at least on the desk there shows one, why I'm willing to support that as well. Maybe it's not filed.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Is there anyone who wishes to speak to the Warner amendment?

CLERK: I have an amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Mr. Clerk, an amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Lynch would move to amend Senator Warner's amendment. (The Lynch amendment, AM2008, appears on page 2379 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam Chairman and members, I certainly have no problem with the Warner amendment as it provides that we have to be accountable for these kinds of scholarship funds and when we call for an annual report that could make and does make sense. However, I hope you would agree with me that it should apply to everybody and anybody that supplies these kinds of postsecondary education scholarship funds. So my amendment to the Warner amendment simply, on page 1, in line 3, after "institution" inserts "and each nonprofit foundation created for the benefit and support of public institutions of higher education", so that anybody involved with this kind of a mechanism to help fund education would and should be as accountable as all of the other postsecondary education systems. Thank you.
