PRESIDENT MOUL: All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. The senators please be seated and please check in. We are accepting roll call votes, or call-in votes on the Hall amendment. Senator Hall.
