So...but on big printing and publishing, for instance, like the big publishing houses, when they ship to their...whomever they're doing that for, they don't pay a sales tax, right?

SENATOR HALL: That's correct.

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, now, see, that's a big point. And, see, I'm trying to help you here, Tim, I really mean that.

SENATOR HALL: Well, I appreciate your comments.

SENATOR CROSBY: I didn't mean to say it...I just don't...I just can't remember, like I couldn't remember about fast food, if you paid on that, paid a sales tax on that. So this...this amendment then would take out the occupation tax, right?

SENATOR HALL: I apologize.

SENATOR CROSBY: The head...what I call the head tax, that would take that employer thing...

SENATOR HALL: That's correct, take out the occupation tax.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...that employee thing out. That does concern me, Tim. And I know, as you say, we've brought in so many
