PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Will. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: The only thing to add to what Senator Hall and Senator Will have stated to you, just a note that on the back of the agenda, we have kind of had to asterisk LB 829, given the uncertainty of where that bill stands on a given day. So you will notice that that, LB 829, the way it actually reads now is as actually written. I think Senator Hall is going to change it to make it apply only the first year there, but that is kind of an unusual circumstance, given the unusual circumstances surrounding LB 829, and we chose to show it that way on the Financial Status on the back of the green sheet. And as Senator Will and Senator Hall stated, obviously, depending on what we do on Select File on LB 829, once LB 829A catches up with it, it will have to reflect, one, on the appropriations side as far as whatever dollar amount we choose to fund the pay out to local governments, that will be...we can change the A bill then accordingly, and also depending on how we choose to raise that revenue, or if we choose to raise that revenue, whatever operations costs that would be entailed by the Revenue Department would be added at that time. So I would simply ask for advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Does anyone else wish to speak to this bill? Seeing none, Senator Hall, do you have closing? Closing is waived. We will now vote on the motion to advance LB 829A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 829A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 829A is advanced. I'd like to direct the senators' attention now to the south balcony. Guests of Senator Abboud this morning are 62 fourth graders from Sandoz Elementary in Omaha.
