

on May 22. At that time, there was a motion to bracket the bill until Tuesday, May 28. The first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Warner. Senator, I do have a note that the one you printed, AM1911, you want to withdraw.

SENATOR WARNER: And substitute.

CLERK: And substitute AM...is it 2143, you want to offer, Senator? I believe it is, if my notes are correct.

SENATOR WARNER: AM2143.

CLERK: AM2143, right.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner. If there are no objections to the substitution, it will be so ordered. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Yeah, Madam President, members of the Legislature, this amendment will be explained in more detail by Senator Hall, but it is a collection included to one that I had originally filed that are, essentially, I believe in the nature of technical amendments, clarifications, of the LB 829, and with that brief explanation, I would yield the balance of the opening to Senator Hall, other than to say that I am in support of the proposed amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, members. Thank you, Senator Warner. You have had passed out on your desk a sheet that reads Explanation of AM2143 to LB 829, Technical, and that is what this amendment is. It is the compilation of about four amendments that were on the bill that all deal with technical aspects to the proposal that whether you would support the bill in its current form or oppose it, I would urge you to vote in the affirmative for the amendment. It is strictly that, technical in nature. It is a clean up that eliminates some language that is duplicative. In some cases, it deals with the issue of refunds as we have put it in place in the proposal, and, frankly, I have an amendment to this amendment that would strike what is currently in the bill, which is the appropriation portion that we advanced from General File to Select File, and I have got to take that up and put it on the desk, as soon as I sign it here, but that is part of what the proposal does.
