

this, this will not be an automatic increase even with those schools that have the growth factor. The other thing that I want to caution you about is that this growth would be actual growth for the last preceding year, or for the preceding year, as reported in the area enrollment audit. So this is not pie-in-the-sky guessing and by golly kind of figures. These are actual figures. As it stands now, public schools that...like Lexington, for instance, or like Lincoln, for instance, that have large growing enrollments have this kind of an opportunity to let their own school boards decide on these increases. I would just urge you to take a look at the figures for Metro for last year. and for the estimated '90-91 year, 11 percent, almost 12 percent growth one year, 10 percent estimated growth for the next year. These are large figures that we are talking about. So, with that, I would just encourage your adoption of this amendment.
