SPEAKER BAACK: The house is under call. All members please report to the Chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. We are voting on the Lowell Johnson amendment and call in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Elmer voting yes. Senator Horgan voting yes.

SPEAKER BAACK: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: The call is raised. The next item on the bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator Elmer. Senator, AM1873. Withdraw?

SPEAKER BAACK: It is withdrawn. The next item.

CLERK: The next amendment, Mr. President, by Senator Schellpeper.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schellpeper. Is anyone authorized to handle this amendment for Senator Schellpeper? It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Moore would move to amend.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Moore.
