SENATOR MORRISSEY: You heard the closing. We will now proceed to vote on the Warner amendment to LR 186. All in favor vote aye, all opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Yeah, Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, so we can dispense with it.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, all opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The house is under call. All senators report to the Chamber. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. All senators please check in, the house is under call. Looking for Senator Baack, Senator Ashford. Senator Chambers, please check in. Senator Conway, Senator Coordsen, please check in. Senator Hillman, please check in. Looking for Senator Withem. Still looking for Senator Withem. Members are all present, we have had a request for a roll call vote. Please proceed. (Gavel.) Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2618-19 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: The amendment fails. Anything else on the desk?
