CLERK: Senator Schellpeper voting yes. Senator Wickersham voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Lindsay voting yes.

SENATOR CONWAY: Will all the members please report to the Chamber, check in and please get into your seats. We are under call. Bernard-Stevens, Senator Peterson, Senator Robinson, would you please get to your seats so that we can proceed. Senator Wesely and Senator Kristensen.
