

SENATOR ELMER: Could we accept call ins?

PRESIDENT MOUL: If you wish to. We've had a request for a roll call vote. Would the senators please be seated so we can proceed. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk, on a roll call vote on the motion to reconsider.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2690 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 16 nays, Madam President, on the reconsideration motion.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. I will raise the call. Is there anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Senator Wehrbein, you had the next amendment, Senator, I understand. Oh, I see, okay, Senator Wehrbein would move to amend AM1728, page 2070. Senator, you want to take up your amendment to the amendment or...? Okay. (See FA188 as found on page 2690 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: So I could introduce briefly first, to explain, I think it might speed it along. Would that be proper?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please proceed, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: This one is on page 2069 and...or 2070-2071. In essence, it provides for half-mile markers along the trail, shall, at one-half mile intervals along such trail place signs warning that departures from the boundaries of the trail, as marked by fences, or otherwise may result in prosecution for trespass, period. That would be what my amended amendment would read. I have the amendment up there that I just filed against this amendment because the rest of the amendment is not appropriate because the amendment we just now did not reconsider is not...the language would not be correct in it. So I simply put a period after "trespass". That's what this amendment to the amendment does. I hope that's clear. It's simply to update this, my amendment that I had filed originally.
