PRESIDENT MOUL: All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. All unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. We are accepting call in votes on the Lynch amendment.

CLERK: Senator Schellpeper voting yes. Senator Conway voting...you had voted yes, Senator Conway. Senator Rod Johnson voting no. Senator Carson Rogers voting yes. Senator Beyer voting no.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The Lynch amendment is adopted. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, the next amendment I have, Senator Smith, you had an amendment printed, Senator. I understand you want to withdraw that one...

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, I'd like to withdraw.

CLERK: ...and offer AM2217.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Madam President. Actually, Senator Hall and I are together on this, aren't we? Isn't his name on there too?

CLERK: Yes, it is.
