SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Crosby, Pirsch, and Smith.

SENATOR CROSBY: I waive off on this one.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I'd just like to read Senator Hall's amendment as it will be amended by Senator Moore, so everybody knows what we are talking about. Starting on page 2, line 7, "Because of the uncertainty of the amount of revenue to be generated from a state lottery, the revenue received from such state lottery shall be credited to a separate lottery account and shall not be credited to the General Fund. The Legislature may appropriate an amount from the lottery account for purposes of establishing, promoting, and maintaining the state lottery, and for any other purposes approved by a majority of the members of the Legislature." Article I, Article III, Article XIII shall not limit in any way the discretion of the Legislature in appropriating money from the lottery account. Article I, Sections 16 and 25, Section 16 says that this money may be used, the Constitution would not prevent this money from being used for any irrevocable grant of special privileges or immunities. And in 25, this money may be used also with discrimination between citizens with respect to the acquisition, ownership, possession, enjoyment, or descent of property. Article III, Section 18 says, this money may be used in any special law in divorces, changing names, laying out, opening, altering, working roads or highways, vacating roads, locating or changing county seats, regulating county and township offices, regulating the practice of courts of justice, regulating the jurisdiction and duties providing for changes of venue in civil and criminal, incorporating cities, towns and villages, providing for election of officers, summoning or impaneling grand or petit juries, providing for the bonding of cities, towns, precincts, school districts or other municipalities. Remember, these are all things that are prohibited from the Legislature to pass special laws in. Management of public schools, opening and conducting of any election or designating sale or mortgage of real estate
