

belonging to minors or others under disability, protection of game or fish, chartering or licensing ferries, toll bridges. Changing the law of dissent. That's quite a list of things that we are opening the door to, not just a window. Article XIII, Section 3, speaks...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...to the lending of credit. And, remember, these would not apply to these prohibitions on the lending of credit. Casual deficits or failures in the revenue contract debts never to exceed in the aggregate \$100,000 and that goes on and on and on. Contract purchase or otherwise acquire, extend. I not only oppose the Moore amendment, I oppose the Hall amendment and I think you better read those things that are excluded from the expenditure of these lottery funds in Article I, Article III and Article XIII that are in this bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR PIRSCH: And...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Senator Crosby, followed by...Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: I'm sorry, Madam President, Ernie was singing to me over there. I just would...at this point, I don't know what we're doing...what this amendment is going to do even with the Moore amendment and since he doesn't know, I think I'm just going to have to stand and say, Senator Moore, at this time I'm going to oppose it and maybe you'll have some time to work it over a little better if you think you still need to have that amendment. But I will oppose this amendment right now. Thank you.
