SENATOR HALL: It's neither.

SENATOR MOORE: Okay.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw AM2236.

PRESIDENT MOUL: If there are no objections, it will be so ordered. The next amendment.

CLERK: Senator Chambers, I assume yours goes away, Senator. Goes away?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hall withdrew his?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Curses, yes, it does go away then.

CLERK: Thank you. Senator Smith would move to amend, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Madam President. First, before I go into this amendment, I would like to tell Senator Hall I certainly do appreciate your withdrawal because I had a whole bunch of things I was going to try to do to your amendment. So that eliminates a little time here and I do appreciate that. I would like to now talk about an amendment that, on behalf of Senator Paul Hartnett, who was not able to be here today so I said that I would introduce this for him. The purpose of this amendment is to ensure that if we have a state lottery, the Legislature does not eliminate any city or county lottery
