

above my feeling about Mr. Bishop, and I'm going to vote for the override, because I think the authority does have a job to do. Senator Wesely has given some persuasive, even compelling arguments. But I still, because if I vote against the override, I can't be sure that I'm not voting against Mr. Bishop, so I'm going to vote for the override, and more than that I cannot say.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Madam President. I have put in an amendment to this bill to take out the 1.4 for '91-92, and leave the million for the next 90...year '92. I'd like to do that because, again I say, I don't want to wipe out the whole program. So at this moment, when we come to a vote, I'm going to ask you to vote for the million for the second year. Senator Chambers, I thank you for reiterating what you just said, because I've heard this before. I know you went through that last year. And you know how I feel about that kind of thing. This...it bothers me completely that anyone would go to north Omaha without knowing ahead of time what the area is like and who the people are there, and go in and not be at...on an even playing field with you and understand what goes on up there, because I have paid attention to the money that you received up there and how it was handled and so on. And I have...I know that the reports have come back. We did hear about that in appropriations. So I certainly...Okay, I'll say that in just a minute. So I certainly don't want you to think that I am forcing something on north Omaha. You know how I feel, you and I have talked about that. So I would ask that we substitute the amendment, that we go for the million dollars for the second year, and let the 1.4 million go, and we'll vote on that. And, if anybody else wants to discuss that part of it, fine. The other thing I'd like to say before I leave this is that within the next week I will have a meeting with the people who run the thing and with the board. And I'm going to get to the bottom of all these allegations, all these questions, all of these concerns because I think this is such a good program for the State of Nebraska. So, if you'll...I respectfully ask that you let me substitute this amendment and go for the million dollars and let the 1.4 go. Thank you.
