PRESIDENT MOUL: Have a motion to call the question. Do I have sufficient seconds? Okay, I see sufficient seconds. All those in favor of ceasing debate please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: She's changed amendments. Can you...I'm trying to understand what is being proposed here, and how that's possible to be done under the veto that was given. Is that possible to divide the question as she's doing?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Going to rule you out of order, Senator Wesely. We have ceased debate, and I'm going to recognize Senator Crosby for closing.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you.

SENATOR WITHEM: Point of order. Point of order. Just point of information, I'm curious at this point, I heard Senator Wesely ask a question of what's being done and I heard a ruling that he's out of order. As a member of the body I would like at least an explanation of what the original, if there's been a change here, what the original motion was, what the secondary...what the motion is now, and how that change came about. Just a point of information as a member that's about to vote. And this is asked in all innocence, because I don't know at this point.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Crosby, I recognized Senator Crosby and she modified her motion to override at that time. Immediately after that, Senator Byars called to cease debate. There were no objections at that point, we immediately went into the vote.

SENATOR WITHEM: ...to close now and explain what we're voting on?

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Crosby will now be recognized...

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay.

PRESIDENT MOUL: ...to close.
