

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. All unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Senator Pirsch, Senator Wesely, Senator Hefner, Senator Hillman, Senator Chambers, please check in. We do have everyone present now. We'll have a roll call vote on the motion to return to Select File.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2935 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 15 nays on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion fails. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Just for a brief point of personal privilege just to explain that I...my closing indicated that the previous amendment would not apply to new exemptions between the decade and that was in error. It would apply to new ones and I wanted to make sure that I did not leave a mistaken impression on the previous amendment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Further motion. I will raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Schmit would move to return the bill. (Schmit amendment appears on pages 2935-37 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Madam President and members, I'm going to offer this amendment again which I offered on Select File. It's very simple. I want to say at the outset that I really had no serious objection to either the Hall amendment nor the Warner amendment. What I do object to is the procedure that we are following whereby we think that we can adopt 186A and resolve the problem if, in fact, the voters vote for that amendment at a special election.
