

Next motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, I have another motion to return, however, a priority motion. Senator Hall would move to reconsider the vote taken yesterday with respect to LR 186CA. That vote, as you may recall, was to place the issue on the special election ballot.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President and members, the proposal would be before us, then, Mr. Clerk, as it was placed on Final Reading and read and received fewer than the 40 votes necessary, is that correct?

CLERK: I'm sorry, Senator.

SENATOR HALL: The proposal would be before us as it was read yesterday and received too few votes to be adopted, is that correct?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you. Ladies and gentlemen, in my conversation with the Governor today I also promised to make a motion to reconsider the vote. Told him up front that I would not support it, that I thought it was important that the Lindsay proposal be adopted. I felt it was consistent with a proposal that was within the Warner amendment that had been adopted that dealt with the 10-year, and limited only to personal property. Senator Warner and I talked about changing that. I made that suggestion to change it to all taxes. If we're going to review them, let's review them all. Lindsay's would have been consistent with that in that it would only have dealt with exemptions under the personal property. This proposal is before us, it needs to be. The Governor deserves the opportunity to have it voted up or down. I'm not going to support it and I would let you make up your own minds on it. Again, I do not believe that this is an appropriate way to deal with this problem. In my opinion, it makes very good sense to wait until you know what the court is going to say. The one thing that Lindsay did was give us an opportunity to learn what the court is thinking on this issue. Right now we don't know. We know what everybody else thinks, but we don't know what the Supreme Court thinks. Lindsay will give us the information we need to
