I don't think it takes very much stretching of the definition of what is in this proposal under Section 4 of whether or not an individual could operate a motor vehicle, even though that has nothing to do with operating the vehicle, it only has to do with parking the vehicle. There is just a lot of unanswered questions although I do agree with the whole concept of saying, look, we don't want people that we know are known past offenders as it relates to sexual offenses, any of the types of things that are listed in Section 3, murder, manslaughter, kidnapping, sexual assault, sexual abuse, I mean the sale of obscene literature, indecency with an animal, you know. Senator Moore, it doesn't sound like you could be a teacher either. You know what is...making terroristic threats, manufacturing, distributing, delivering, possession, possession with intent to deliver, selling or exchanging controlled substances; imitation controlled substance or drug paraphernalia. I guess, in other words, if an individual owned, you know, what used to be called a head shop back in the seventies, that individual could have been busted by the local police and even though they may have had a Ph.D., under this bill although it does say you can take into consideration the time, the age of the person at the time the offense was committed, you still have in place, in statute, under this law, under this bill rather, the ability for a school district to at any point in time say, no, we don't feel that individual, if they are applying for a job there, is qualified. And that doesn't mean we shouldn't have the ability to look at some of these things. I think much of the problem with the legislation as I...at least in Sections 3 and 4, and I have to be honest with you, outside of the Section 1, and 1, 2, 3, 4, those are the only ones I've read so far, the problem is the laundry list that we have here and I think Senator Crosby clearly points that out tongue in cheek although this is...
