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SENATOR CHIZEK: And then they would provide the information that the FBI or that the patrol would forward to the FBI. They would do the national check and forward it back.

SENATOR ROBINSON: What does the school ask for when they call the state patrol? Is there any specific...what specifics are there?

SENATOR CHIZEK: Just a minute, Senator. There are two areas that were, primarily, any reasonable and rational relationship to employment in a position working with minors, sexual offense and sexual convictions, sexual assault convictions and drug convictions.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay. Now another question, this would just be on future applicants. This has nothing to do with people that are already employed, is that right, as I read it?

SENATOR CHIZEK: That is correct.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, I think this is a reasonable compromise and I think we ought to put the problem to rest. I think it is a step forward and I'd urge all the members of the body to vote in a positive way. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: I would just, Mr. Speaker, and members, I just want to remind you that with all this wonderful talk about how we have got such high regard for teachers and how they are held to a higher standard, remember that when it comes time to vote for salaries for teachers. Just thought I would remind you all of that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Anyone else wishing to address the amendment by Senator Chizek. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Just briefly, Mr. President. So the body at least understands my rationale for whatever it is worth, which in many cases is not that much, Senator Chizek, I will be supporting your amendment simply because if the body chooses to advance a bad bill, it certainly is better with your amendment. It raises it up from a lower level to a higher lower level and that needs to be done. And so for that reason, I will be
