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problem, it will be the citizens of the State of Nebraska I will go for and I asked him again because I have experienced in my life working for a large corporation the pressures of subtle and not so subtle pressures that a corporation can apply to you in your day to day work on the job that can make you stop and think about what you're doing, whether you do what is right for the state or the citizens or what is right per what the corporate executives think. And I asked the nominee if at his age, which I estimated to be 40, 41, in there, he could make a decision for the citizens of the State of Nebraska that might cause such grief to the corporate executives that he worked for that he could possibly have to decide to look for a new job in a new area. And he assured me that he could and that he would decide in favor of the citizens of Nebraska. I asked each and every nominee the same question. Can you decide for the citizens in the State of Nebraska as opposed to your own personal interests and your own financial interests and each and every one of them answered right off the bat without even hesitating, you bet, no problem, Senator, I can do that. Each and every one of them except for one of them, one of them that we rejected or did not move and he actually sat back and said, well that's a tough question, that's really a tough question. And he sat there and he thought about it and said, I really don't know. I think I would do what was best for the State of Nebraska and I have always worked hard to do what I think is for the State of Nebraska and I think I would be able to separate myself from that question. Now he is one of the few that have, when I asked that question, have ever sat back and thought about it and answered in what I considered a very honest, thoughtful, nonautomatic manner. So I guess I'll just conclude right now for now by saying, we did question the nominees and gave a lot of thought and a lot of debate to some of their nominations and rejections and I might add that one of the folks that we did not move, we did so because we hadn't heard from him right now and we're waiting to hear from him. We're thinking possibly he might have been on vacation and hadn't been able to contact the committee to let us know exactly what his feelings were on his nomination to Environmental Control Council. So in my official position as Vice-Chair of the Environmental Control...or Natural Resources Committee, I would move the committee report on the Governor's nominees for Environmental Control Council.
