SENATOR WILL:        Mr. Speaker, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 262.

SPEAKER BAACK:      You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further to the bill, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK:      Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL:      Mr. Speaker, I move the advancement of LB 262 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK:      You've heard the motion to advance LB 262. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. We will now proceed to General File, LB...LR 20CA.

CLERK:        Mr. President, LR 20 was introduced by Senators Wesely and Baack. (Read.) The resolution was introduced in January of last year, at that time it was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee for hearing. The resolution was advanced to General File. I do have Government Committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK:      Senator Conway, on the committee amendments to LR 20.

SENATOR CONWAY:     Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. LR 20, if you recall, is the legislation associated with the changing of our start-up time of this body with respect to following an election. The discussion, and Senator Wesely, I'm sure, will allude to some of the rationale behind it. But to address the committee amendment that was offered to the legislation you need to put it a little bit in context, and that being that starting prior to the holiday season, and having some organizational time in the legislative makeup of a long session, following an election, to put the Legislature in order so that they can start conducting business when we arrive on the...in January was the general concept. And what the committee amendment says is that on...the long sessions would start on the fifth Wednesday, following the general election, starting in 1992 (sic), and then would meet for three days. Then we would adjourn and reconvene at our normal meeting time, which is the first Wednesday after
