SENATOR WITHEM: Okay, so my rationale...I would say my rationale for asking a division may not be valid and perhaps your opposition to support or...it's really just a replacement so I will withdraw my request for a division.

SENATOR HALL: Yeah, I'm not opposing it. I misspoke if I said to oppose it.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Withem. Senator Withem. Senator Withem, did I understand you are withdrawing...

SENATOR WITHEM: If that's permissible, I will withdraw my request for the division.
