amendment to the Ashford amendment so that it puts it into the same dollars. Thank you.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. We are on Senator Schellpeper's amendment to the amendment. Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: What's the division? I don't know technically how to do it. I didn't have the amendment in front of me to know where to do it, but I am requesting a division in that we deal with the question of the livestock as a separate issue and leave the remainder of the amendment as another issue.

SENATOR CONWAY: Senator Withem, would it be okay with you if we would go to Senator Pirsch to speak on the amendment while you decide your division?

SENATOR WITHEM: I have decided my division. I don't have an amendment in front of me to know where to ask for the technical division, so I'm using the same rationale as the proponents are. I am requesting that the issue of livestock exemption be divided and treated as a separate issue.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Clerk, would you read some things into the record. We have a priority motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, amendments to be printed to LB 1063 by Senator Hefner and Senator Hall, and Senator Bernard-Stevens to LB 447. (See pages 1056-57 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have a priority motion and that motion is to adjourn. That is offered by Senator Ashford.

SENATOR CONWAY: Okay, there has been a request for a machine vote. We're voting on adjournment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 3 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adjourn.

SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We do not have the specific amendment for the division on the desk and the Chair will rule that we can't recognize it until we do, so we will continue with Senator Pirsch.
