

be implemented and this clearly allows them to evaluate that legislation, how it was implemented and then approve it if they choose to do so by voting for the constitutional amendment. And I would hope that the body would adopt it. The committee amendment restricted this to this year. It's not a permanent part of the Constitution that can always be applied. It's uniquely applied at this time for this issue and I hope the body would support the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard Senator Warner's closing and we are voting on the fourth part of the amendment that was divided into five parts. We will now vote on this portion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BAACK: This portion of the amendment to the committee amendments has been adopted. We will now proceed to the final portion. Is that not correct, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, that is correct, the fifth portion.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Warner, on the fifth portion of the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is the change in the language that would appear on the ballot and to reflect these changes that's on the second page that was handed out. I would move its adoption. It's not making a substantive change in the constitutional provision but it was rewritten to reflect these changes that have been included in the amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Discussion on this portion of the amendment? Seeing none, Senator Warner, do you wish to close? Waives closing. We will now vote on the final portion of the amendment to the amendment offered by Senator Warner. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment to the committee amendments.
