SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, I think what happens is that contract becomes void but it's a matter of who breached the contract. Did the state do something to cause the breach of that contract? The state would argue, obviously, that this is a material part of the contract they had no control over, they did everything they were to do and that would be the Department of Revenue and that would be their argument that we didn't do anything to cause this to be wrong. I mean, that, obviously, would get litigated in a breached contract.

SENATOR MOORE: Yes. But it's one of those things I think, as I mentioned, it's not meant to confuse, it's meant to point out what I think is one of the things going on and Senator Horgan, Senator Horgan is still here. I almost...I want to get that speech transcribed as soon as possible because, in your opinion, you're saying we need to change the Constitution so we can hand out exemptions like 775. Am I incorrect in interpreting your speech that way, Senator Horgan? I don't want you to get in trouble, but that's what I heard you saying is that, yes, we need to change the Constitution so we can do more things like 775.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Horgan.

SENATOR HORGAN: (Microphone not activated)...is an example of an exemption that needs to be provided and you can only probably do that with constitutional approval in the future and we ought to do that, yes.

SENATOR MOORE: I think Senator Horgan strikes it why there are people who want to change the Constitution because...I agree with you, Senator Horgan. Under the present Constitution you can't grant 775 exemptions, in my opinion. And if you can't grant farm machinery exemptions, I don't know how you can grant 775 exemptions, and I think you hit the nail on the head when you're saying the reason this constitutional amendment is before us is so we can grant 775 exemption, which is fine, but let's say that. And you said it, not me, you said that's exactly why...
