

that refund with substantiating that it was bought to use for agricultural purpose and which the sales tax was paid and then the department will refund that sales tax, but the department will notify the county that that piece of equipment should be put on the depreciable tax rolls for that taxpayer as it was received, the refund. That's the substantive, two substantive changes. Others I now have detail in my hand here, but they are all clarifications and not any substantive change, anything that would be substantive. I have indicated there is a minor amendment also on Senator Wickersham's amendment, which...to narrow the purchase definition so we do not have inadvertently exempt property transferred by other than purchase of, but I assume, Senator Wickersham, you are looking at that and I believe it's consistent. So, unless there's a question on one of these others, to the extent that I can, I can explain it, but they are all...says, clarification, and then it goes on to indicate what that clarification might have been.

SPEAKER BAACK: You have an amendment to the amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend Senator Lindsay and Lamb's amendment.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. Chairman and members,...

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: ...I would move to amend the amendment by adding a provision that a fee of \$10 per ton be attached to any sludge that is used as a soil fertilizer that is sold out of a city treatment plant. I think that it's pretty obvious, ladies and gentlemen, I do not know and it's always...I wish Senator Landis was here. Senator Landis is one of those individuals who, from time to time, does a pretty good job of negotiating, but Senator Landis is an expert at negotiating. I think he teaches the course. I do not know and I'm not going to be critical of my rural colleagues who might have accepted this amendment. I would suspect it might be my good friend from the west, Bernard-Stevens, but there may be others. I would hope that the rest of us will take a lesson in negotiation from Senator Landis because if we buy this kind of a proposal, we just as well jump off the bridge in south Omaha. There isn't any rationale to some of these proposals. Ladies and gentlemen, you ought to get one thing understood and when you stand on this floor and say,
