PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Madam Chair. I probably won't add anything to the debate but I would just like to reiterate some of the things that have already been said. The things that are in the amendment, of course, are the collection fee changed as Senator Rasmussen has explained, took out the word "nitrogen" so that it's not as restrictive as to the fertilizer and that is what really we were talking about from the first as far as the tonnage is concerned and then the other substantial change or probably the only substantial change is changing the date when this tax would begin from July 1 to April 1. That is a change that some people won't care for, but that's what is in this amendment and it may have some significance for some people, but I'm guessing that when the word gets out that this is the way it is, there will be a lot of fertilizer sold before April 1 and very little sold after April 1 for a month or two. Guess that's about all I can add to the debate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lamb. Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Madam President and members, the issue of the April 1 date has been well discussed and I think that may or may not be a problem. The problem is a lot of that, this forward contract and it creates a problem on changing the pressures of people but as much as we're inconveniencing people anyway with the bill, it don't make a whole lot of difference, I guess, but the one question I do have for, I don't know, Senator Landis isn't here. Coordsen, does Senator Coordsen, is he the cosponsor of the amendment of the supposed, Senator Coordsen. I think Senator Coordsen...

SENATOR COORDSEN: Sir.

I know we're discussing the reconsideration but a technical concern that we've already discussed briefly, you and I, I know that there is a funding problem with the bill.
