

SENATOR MOORE: Senator Warner, I agree with you. I would be much more comfortable on that too and that's why it's so...I understand why the CA has to pass...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR MOORE: One minute? I understand why the CA has to pass on Thursday or we'll...the Speaker will probably have us in session on Friday and I know I don't want to do that. And so I understand why the CA has to pass but I do not understand why 1063 has to get in the final form. I think the prudent thing to do is not pass it, get it over to Final Reading. I do not think it should be voted on until...sometime after the constitutional amendment is the only time you can really pass that bill. It's kind of a waste of time, in my opinion, to pass it now, because you can go out and tell the voters it's binding, but I don't think it really is. And, as I have said, if you do what...the cloture rule and everything, if you pass the CA, I think you can look forward to seven days in May to make sure that what you've done works, because I don't think it does. And so I don't know why the hurry to vote cloture on a bill that's not even ready to go, one; two, a bill that doesn't need to go, and, three, a bill for obvious reasons that I have said for weeks now it's a bad bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Senator Morrissey, followed by Senators Beutler, Schmit, Robinson, Hall and Warner. Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Madam President, and members, I guess there is not too much left to say after Senator Hall and Senator Moore's discussion. I have the same problems, same concerns. Again, it was mentioned that just because we haven't crossed all the t's and dotted all the i's is no reason to hold the bill here as it is now. And many that will vote for the suspension of the rules and movement of the bill are people that wouldn't generally ever consider that. And I understand we're under pressure and under time constraints and everyone's nerves are a little frazzled, but I...I will vote against suspending the rules because I think if you're going to do it, you need to get it...you need to get it right. I definitely agree, Senator Moore, I think we need to run that...run the CA and see where we're at on that. I, again, would refer to some of Senator Schmit's amendments that were very valid, again, concerns with
