Senator Moore, we're not talking about adults choosing to do what they want to do. We're talking about the products of an industry that is deliberately targeting our young people. And we have an amendment that is attached to 130 now, LB 130, which makes these...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...products available to our young people. I say the attachment of that amendment was wrong, and I do say that those who oppose this amendment that I'm offering are engaging in hypocrisy. They can dislike it all they want to. The truth is that whenever they stand up again and make those pitches for the welfare of our children, or these so called family values, we will know that they don't really mean it if to stand for those programs they have to come against either those with liquor licenses or the tobacco industry, which wields tremendous influence in this country and around the world.
