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package and I would hope that Senator Johnson will address that entire package during the next interim period. I commend Senator Beutler. I respect him. I know what he's trying to do and...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR SCHMIT: ...I admire him for his foresight, but I would hope that you would give us, Senator Beutler, a little bit more of a parochial point of view and guarantee to that urban legislator or that urban dweller that we will not shut off their water and, in the meantime guarantee to the rural dweller that they will not be denied their right to water as a source of their livelihood. I would support the bracket motion, but I have to agree with Senator Crosby and many others, Senator Lindsay, the issue is not going to go away and the votes are going to be there. If they're not there this year, then certainly next year, and so we better have our ducks in order and have the questions answered prior to that time, and thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schmit. Senator Dierks. Senator Dierks. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Question.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Do I see sufficient seconds? I do. We'll now vote on the motion to cease debate. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have ceased debate. I will recognize Senator Johnson for closing.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Thank you, Madam President. In order to expedite this whole process, I guess I would like to ask for call of the house. Several people have wandered from the floor and we'll probably have one either at the front end or at the tail end so just as well do it now.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
