

any chemical containers at all. I don't know where they're going to go, unless the chemical dealers will begin to take them back. But there are items, I'm sure, that are going to be very difficult to find a place to put them if you have this section in the bill. So, from a practical standpoint, I'm not sure, while the objective is good, I suppose, from a practical standpoint, to meet that and to have a system in place is going to help those rural constituencies who are disposing of their waste now, maybe not the best way but the way that it's been done is going to be hard, I think, for people to change those practices in a relatively overnight fashion in an 18-month period. So I'm asking for this particular section to be stricken from the committee amendments by simply dividing the question and voting against having it in the committee amendments.
