LB 728, 1099, 1099A

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, Madam Chair and members of the body, in response to Senator Robak's question about the number of states, there are quite a number of states that have, in fact, passed, either passed or considered legislation. It is not just Minnesota. List of about 16 states, I can make this available to you. Would merely urge you to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. We will now vote on the motion to advance LB 1099. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 1099.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1099 is advanced. LB 1099A.

CLERK: LB 1099A, Madam President, introduced by Senator Withem. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: I believe the figure is about 38,000 dollars, which is designed to create the materials for the education program, pay for some staff time doing that, and to do the blood sampling and tissue typing of the potential volunteers. Would urge the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. Does anyone wish to address this bill? Seeing none, we will now vote on the motion to advance LB 1099A. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 1099A.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 1099A is advanced. LB 728.

CLERK: LB 728, Madam President, was a bill introduced by Senator Ashford, Rasmussen, Chizek, Will and Abboud. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 23 of last year, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Judiciary Committee, Madam President.
