

15 cents a gallon difference. And so it's kind of a hard bill to support, but it does make sense.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Senator Schellpeper. Do we have sufficient seconds to call the question? We do. Now vote on the motion to cease debate. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the motion to cease debate? Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have ceased debate. I'll recognize Senator Lindsay on the motion to bracket.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Madam President, the bracket, to remind the body, the bracket is to 4-16 of '92, effectively kills the bill. Senator Abboud has indicated that he will be planning for a special session to handle this once it gets unbracketed. I would urge that the bill be bracketed. I understand Senator Conway's concern about wanting an up or down vote. I think this can pretty well be seen as an up or down vote on the bill, but if the bill doesn't have the support we ought to move on to some bills that do have support. For that reason I would, and I oppose the bill too, straightforward about that, but I would urge the adoption of the bracket motion.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. We will now vote on the motion to bracket. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I'd ask for a call of the house, accept call-ins.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a request for a call of the house. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chamber and record their presence. All unauthorized personnel must leave the floor. The house is under call. Will the senators please check in. I will remind
