It's a perfect example of what I'm trying to say in the sense that we are putting all our energy, and our time, and our resources...

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: ...into battling over something where we are never going to have an agreement, at the expense of coming up with good solutions. Surgeon General Koop said, in 1988, he only wanted 500 cases of measles, that was his goal. We missed the mark, folks, it was 27,000 cases, 89 of them resulted in death, totally prevented...totally preventable by childhood vaccinations, but we don't put our time, we don't put our money, we don't put our energy into getting those things done. And much of it is because we get delayed, we get sidetracked by the debate regarding the legal status of abortion. It's time, folks, to move in a different direction. And I encourage you to support this amendment as well as Senator Bernard-Stevens'.
