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suffering. It is one to be chosen as an individual in the face of their own ethical views in their understanding of what they think the teachings of a supreme being and the sense of ethical value that they place on the fetus and what others call and what I would acknowledge at some point along the line is, in fact, an unborn life. I, for one, don't think that we could do anything other than this. There is no way this issue will go away. There's no way that people with convictions will avoid acting them out. There'll be no way that those of us who oppose, for example, the convictions of John Lindsay will sit in our seats...

SENATOR WARNER: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ..and not talk and not vote and not speak. We will be locked in this dilemma as long as I...as I can conceive of.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Pirsch. The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. Those in favor of ceasing debate...ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Call of the house, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Call of the house is requested. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Motion carried. The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Members not present in the Chamber, return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel would leave the floor. Senator Bohlke, you want to check in, please. Senator Lamb, Senator Beutler, Senator Peterson, Senator Chambers, Senator Cudaback, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Wesely, Senator Hartnett, please return to the Chamber, check in. Senator Hartnett, Senator Chambers, please return to the Chamber, check in. Senator Hartnett. All are present. Senator Pirsch, were you requesting a roll call vote?

SENATOR PIRSCH: I believe Senator Landis did.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Landis did? Roll call vote. Motion is to cease debate. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Clerk,
