call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1880 of Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: Motion is carried. Debate ceases. Senator Lindsay, you wish to close?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President. What hasn't been said? (Laughter.) It's difficult because I'd certainly like to be brief, but I can't quote Senator Chambers from last night because I don't hate the bill so that doesn't work. Actually, I guess at this point it might be appropriate just to kind of remind the body what we're voting on. We got to this point from Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment or...yeah, amendment. The...after that, Senator Hillman and Rasmussen had an amendment which would ask the...create a task force to address some teen or adolescent health problems including the issue of teen pregnancy. It was further amended by Senator Rasmussen, who had an amendment which urged the body or required that the body work together to try to find the causes of unwanted pregnancies, and what the Lindsay amendment to the amendment would do is to strike that portion of the amendment supported by Senator Bernard-Stevens, with a twofold purpose. One is, I think it's important that we do address those other issues. That's what the debate has talked about. The contrary side, of course, is that it does take out that portion that says strike the original contents of LB 78. This would leave LB 78 intact. Probably the most compelling reason to vote for it is if we can get the amendment attached, Bernard-Stevens would have one amendment that won. Seriously, it's...the...never mind.

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Lindsay has closed. Those in favor of voting...or those in favor of the Lindsay amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Requires a simple majority of those voting. Call. Roll call has been requested. We're under call. Clerk will call the roll. The members will be attentive so that the Clerk may hear the votes.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1880-81 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 9 nays on adoption of the amendment to the amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR WARNER: The amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments to the amendment, Mr. Clerk?
