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to limit it.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Senator Crosby, I would be glad to answer that from my perspective. The answer would be absolutely yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: Oh, okay, and then I think when you start talking about adolescent pregnancies and health things and that whole perspective, we have to consider why teenagers are so sexually active, and why we talk about...we never tell them, I mean, would you, like, include abstinence as a subject?

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: If you started working in all these things, are you going to include the idea of abstaining altogether...

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...for teenagers? Okay. If this doesn't go, and I have my light on because I'm perfectly serious about what I am asking because I think we need to know what we want to do with this. If it doesn't go here tonight, will you consider putting in some kind of resolution or even asking the Governor to establish something like this? You are not going to just drop it, I hope.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: No, I am not going to drop it.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay, Senator Hillman, you, too.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: In fact, could I...I will try to be brief because it is your time.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: But, in fact, Dr. Horton, in our meeting with Senator Hillman and I this morning, we talked about highlighting the need for addressing issues related to adolescents. Not that we are doing enough about young children, but we are doing practically nothing about adolescents and discussed various ways to do (interruption)...

SENATOR WARNER: Time.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: ...possibility of the commission.

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
