Before I see the FIFRA elephant sitting in the wheelbarrow, I just want to caution that I'm going to start dragging my feet. And I've got forty amendments for three or four different bills up there, I can transfer them to this bill, if it needs to be. I commend Senator Morrissey, he's done a lot of work. And, Senator Morrissey, it's just like Senator...Senator Chambers cautioned me about 718. I got my thoroughbred on the track and he's running at about a minute and a half for a six furlong race, and Senator Chambers has threatened to put his saddle on that horse. And if you let too many saddles get on this horse, and 150 pound jockey, 1257 is going to run that race at a mighty slow time, and it isn't going to make it to the finish line. And so I'm just cautioning you. I don't like it. I think that we're getting awfully proactive out there in the lobby. We've got an awful lot of folks out there been playing golf and doing other things, and the last two days they decide to get into this action. I know it's been agreed upon, but there is nothing makes me more angry anymore than these agreed upon deals that no one heard a damn thing about until it hit the board. And who has it been agreed upon? By the people who are getting their dipper in the bucket, and going to be added onto the light bill,
