Madam President, pursuant to that letter, received a communication from the Governor appointing Senator Bohlke to her seat, along with the various documentation certifying her taking the oath of office, bond requirements, etcetera. (See pages 7-8 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, I have received a series of appointment letters to various state boards and commissions. Those will be referred to the Reference Committee for referral to Standing Committees for confirmation hearing during the Special Session. (See pages 9-18 of the Legislative Journal.)

In addition to those items, I have received a series of reports and announcements. Report from the Board of Public Roads, Classifications and Standards; an annual report from the Highway Safety Division; report from the Nebraska Business Development Center; Comprehensive Annual Financial Report from the state; series of audit reports from the State Auditor; communications received from the State of Montana regarding a resolution that was adopted by their State Legislature. That will be on file in my office. A series of reports from the Department of Social Services. I have an Attorney General's Opinion from Attorney General Stenberg. And, Madam President, I received a notice requirement filed pursuant to statute from the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority. That's all that I have, Madam President.
