SENATOR LAMB: Would you have any hint as to what this bill is going to contain that's coming forward today?

SPEAKER BAACK: I do not know. You know, I have not seen the bill yet. The Revenue Committee has been working on a bill. I think they're going to go back into Executive Session, I think, as...after we recess today and work on something too. I think the Revenue Committee maybe having a bill that they are also having drafted along with the Governor's proposal that's being drafted.

SENATOR LAMB: Would it be fair to ask Senator Hall to enlighten us on this?

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Hall, would you like to enlighten us?

SENATOR HALL: I don't know that that's possible, Senator Baack, but I'll do what I can. I will answer Senator Lamb's question and that is what will the proposed bills contain. I can't speak for the Governor's proposal because I have not seen it. It's my understanding the Governor came and talked to the Revenue Committee, stated that he does intend to expand the call. The expansion of the call is to include the issue of implementing the MAPCO case, the lawsuit that the Supreme Court rendered the decision on. In other words, the legislation would include the statutory authority and standards, regulations, oversight for the local assessors to begin putting personal property tax back on the rolls, in other words, the reporting requirements, time lines, things of that nature. It is substantive legislation in that this is not a two-page bill. It's something that probably will look along the lines of about anywhere from 20 to 40 pages. The draft that the Revenue Committee has asked bill drafters to start work on and they currently have is taken out of the old 1970s law and we modified it a little bit but it is not anything that is unfamiliar to the Legislature, at least past Legislatures, and not unfamiliar to the entities that would be affected. But it still is collecting tax on personal property and the statutory means to allow for that to take place. The call itself, I have not seen the proclamation so I can't tell you. It's my understanding that it would...the proposal that we are drafting would be within that call. The Governor has a
