SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Let's say that you use the pasture to park cars next to the fairgrounds, that they park two days a year just...they parked. That certainly, the parking lot, for two days next to a fairground wouldn't be agriculture use. Would those two days disqualify you?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me tell you what I'm contemplating. If the purpose of that was to make money, and that's the primary income from that land and it's what you really want to use it for, but you call it agricultural land the rest of the year so that it will be valued at the agricultural level for tax purposes, even though the main use is as a parking lot, then that would not qualify for the preferential treatment as agricultural land.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Who makes the decision of whether it would qualify or would not qualify?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You would look at the la...if it's used, not exclusively, for agricultural purposes during the taxing period, it would not qualify for the preferential treatment.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: But wouldn't the county assessor have to be the one that would make that decision?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Always, but it could be challengeable if somebody would, and I don't know who would or why.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay. Okay, and I think that leads me then to my point here, is that you're going to have some of these what I would call just diminimus uses, small uses, maybe small parcels, or maybe the entire use of the property for just a short period of time, that you're going to go ahead and try to disqualify and say, no, no, you've got to pay, or fashion some proportionate use. You may say, look,...

SPEAKER BAACK: One minute.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...it only, for maybe one three-hundredth of a year, is used for this purpose, so we're going to value part of it at one three-hundredth of market value for a parking lot, or we may do it for the rest of the year at ag lands. You're going to place county officials in a tremendous bind on how to make those determinations, because you're talking about discretion. And the more that you use exclusive, and Senator
