

what am I supposed to do? And, quite frankly, I don't know either and I think you're offering them at least a proposal for how they should behave and so I want to fill in so they can say, well, at least here is what the Legislature discussed about us doing because I think they're hopelessly on a limb out here one way or the other. So when would you assume that they would have to have this sort of thing back in?

SENATOR HALL: Well, they would...Senator Kristensen, first of all, the...you know, we dealt with...we did work with Jack Mills from the County Officials Association in trying to draft something that would be as workable as possible which isn't very easy under the time lines. But we did change the reporting date. So, in other words, the issue of reporting your personal property would be extended from the March...traditional March 1 time line. For tax year '90-91 it would now be October 1. Okay.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, so they would have to have their reports back in by the 1st of October?

SENATOR HALL: The taxpayer...

SENATOR WARNER: One minute.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right.

SENATOR HALL: ...to the assessor. The taxpayer to the assessor would have to have their...the list basically of their personal property to the assessor. Okay. What we do is we change the levy dates from September 27th to October 20th and then the tax date being due and owed on November 1, excuse me, from November 1 to December 1.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: December 1. Okay. Now, it seems to me though that what's going to happen is we should wait until after we see what the election is going to be before we do this. Right?

SENATOR HALL: That is one argument.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: And the election will probably take place in September, early September?

SENATOR HALL: September 17th, I think, is the way the bill is
