SENATOR HALL: No, keep reading, it says all livestock whose home range is located in a state other than Nebraska, but which during a part of the year graze in Nebraska shall be assessed and taxed in the county or counties in Nebraska in which the livestock graze for the full taxes of each year during which the livestock graze in Nebraska, except that if the state in which the home range of such livestock is located enacts legislation by which livestock whose home range is located in Nebraska, but which graze...it is a reciprocal agreement is what it amounts to, Senator Haberman.
