

All those in favor please vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Madam President, I'd ask for a call of the house and roll call vote.

PRESIDENT MOUL: We have a motion to place the house under call. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The house is under call. Would all unexcused senators please return to the Chambers and record their presence. Would the senators please be seated and please check in. The house is under call. Senator Cudaback, Senator Byars, Senator Moore, please check in. Senator Rogers, Senator Schmit, please check in. We will now proceed with the roll call vote on the motion to advance LB 6. Would you please be seated so we can proceed with the roll call vote.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 127-28 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 10 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 6.

PRESIDENT MOUL: LB 6 is advanced. Now recognize Speaker Baack.

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President, and colleagues, I will give you my plan for all we need to do this evening, because we do need to get this bill back yet from the Bill Drafter's. It has to be sent up and the new amendments added to this bill. It's going to take some time. I would suggest that we stand at ease until about eleven forty-five, and then at that point we will come back into session, accept that bill down from the Bill Drafter's Office, then at twelve-oh-one we could go into session to do our layover day at twelve-oh-one, then we would not have to come back tomorrow. But we do need 25 people here yet at twelve-oh-one to do that. So we will stand at ease now until eleven forty-five.
