

used your little game in my district and showed them how tough it is. It's tough. We have tried. There have been people that have tried, tried to form coalitions, tried to do what they thought was right. I think we're all...we're doing that but you just find it impossible in this atmosphere sometimes to get 40 people to agree. Somebody was concerned that we would spend \$600,000 on election that would only be a temporary constitutional solution. Well, I'm glad you are concerned now. We're spending that per month on the low-level facility, folks, so go explain that to them when they ask you about that money. Say what about the million on the low-level every month? Are you worried about that? So let's do this. I think it's an effort to give it some studied...a studied look. I preferred the original option but that's not there. It's obviously not there, never will be no matter what we do. Let's go this route and let the people have time to think about it, let people have time to give more input and see if we can come to a consensus later. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Morrissey. Senator Landis, you're next.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members of the Legislature, my preference at this point in the consideration of the session would be to look at LR 1 with respect to the 30-vote maximum necessary to put this on the general election ballot in 1992. I'm not inclined to spend \$600,000 because we can't make up our mind or because we're going to buy ourselves a year. And if we couldn't do the 30 votes, my preference then is to adjourn. And having brought ourselves to the pass that we are and are unable to summon the votes necessary to do LR 1 in its appropriate form, I'm not inclined to ask the public to have a special election, spend the money and basically say, look, we can't come up with a...we can't come up with this course of action to empower ourselves to do what we need to be done but give us another year and maybe we will think ahead and plan that we ought to have the power to be able to act. In that case, if we are actually on the shoals which was the point that I thought that Senator Hall was making at the point in which we couldn't get the votes to do LR 1, I think we ought to recognize it and go home and make whatever peace we can with ourselves and our constituents.
