

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, I do, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I apologize if I erred in saying that it split more counties than at present time. However, the statement was made here on the floor that the Governor contacted the committee and made some remarks as to let's go ahead with southwest Nebraska. That's not true. The Governor did not contact the committee. The Governor did not make any advancement to the committee that he was willing to consider southwest Nebraska. What the Governor said was quote in the paper, "if there is a consensus pertaining to southwest Nebraska, I will consider the bill." Senators, there is no consensus. To me, consensus means if there is agreement. There is no agreement. So the Governor is not saying to you folks under the call consider southwest Nebraska redistricting. As it is now, the way the district is redistricted, it only affects 1,544 people in Red Willow County, 1,544 people is the only people that it affects. The other 10,161 people remain in the McCook-Red Willow area; 10,161 remain; 1,544, all rural, goes to district 44. So I will say let's support indefinitely postponing the bill. Those folks are not harmed as the figures show they're not harmed. And let's vote to indefinitely postpone LB 15. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the closing on the motion to indefinitely postpone. We will now vote on that motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Haberman.
