SENATOR CROSBY: To make...to make cuts.

SENATOR MOORE: ...caused primarily because of accelerated Medicaid expenditures.

SENATOR CROSBY: We're making cuts. All right, the second thing is...

SENATOR MOORE: Making adjustments is the word I prefer to use.

SENATOR CROSBY: All right, we're making adjustments, we're making adjustments because of that...the gap, if you like to call it that. The second thing is this though, Senator Moore, there were no tax bills introduced in this department...in this...from revenue. Revenue brought no tax bills in, right?

SENATOR MOORE: That's true.

SENATOR CROSBY: We are not raising anybody's taxes, neither are we lowering anybody's taxes at this time. I mean, local taxes...

SENATOR MOORE: That's true.

SENATOR CROSBY: I think the property owners and everyone, I mean some things have been said to make it sound like, oh well, yeah, this would be great, our taxes will go down. That isn't the case at all. So I just think that should be clear. I don't want any big argument about that, I'm not asking for that. All I'm saying is the taxpayers out there should know that what we're doing is making adjustments because of the gap, as you like to call it, Senator Moore. But at this...during this session we are doing nothing that will necessarily, if you want to use...you want to qualify it at all, will not necessarily lower anybody's taxes. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Anyone else wishing to address the advancement of LB 20? Seeing no one, Senator Lindsay, did you wish to close?

SENATOR LINDSAY: I simply move the bill.
