SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Landis, I will say that it would be in order, yes, if you would wish to do that.

SENATOR LANDIS: Now let me ask, that motion would be available to be made by whom, people who voted no on the original motion and people who didn't vote?

SPEAKER BAACK: That is correct.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you for answering that.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I do. Enrollment and Review reports LB 1 as correctly engrossed; LB 13, LB 14, LB 20, LB 21, as correctly engrossed. Those are signed by Senator Will. New resolution by Senator Withem. (Gave brief description of LR 7.) That will be laid over. And I have an amendment to be withdrawn by Senator Schmit to LB 26. (See pages 160-61 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have a motion.

SPEAKER BAACK: The call is raised.

CLERK: And that motion is Senator Beutler would move to reconsider Senator Schimek's amendment to her amendment, AM81.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I simply feel very strongly that we should get out of this what we can all do together and that we should get something out of this in terms of budget reduction. Obviously, we have not made enough of a compromise on this particular issue in order to advance the bill and I'm simply asking for the reconsideration of the Schimek amendment which I will vote for, not because I agree with it entirely but because I would rather have half a loaf, if there cannot be a whole loaf. And I think probably others share that opinion and I suspect that it would be worthwhile to go back and put Senator Schimek's amendment on and hopefully reach a compromise on this issue. And, for that purpose, I would ask for reconsideration of the amendment.
